Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2013-2013 educational progress for the Vestaburg High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Brandon Hubbard, High School Principal for assistance.

The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the following web site www.mischooldata.com or you may review a copy in the principal's office at your child's school. The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Vestaburg was identified as a Priority School in 2013, however, since then the scores have continue to show steady growth and it expected that the high school will be dismissed during the 2016-2017 school year.

Status of School Improvement Plan

District and School Improvement Plans have been submitted and approved annually.

Status of Core Curriculum

All curricula are aligned with the Michigan Core Curriculum and are available on the district web site in Curriculum Crafter. In addition, district personnel are engaged in transitioning to the Common Core state Standards for English Language Arts, Mathematics and Literacy Standards for Social Studies, Science and Technical Subjects and to the Next Generation Science Standards for science. Curriculum review / development process at VHS is ongoing, collaborative, and focused on both horizontal and vertical K-12 alignment to insure student achievement of content and process standards.

At Vestaburg we offer our students many opportunities and a well-rounded education. For example, many students (25% or more of juniors and seniors) at Vestaburg High School Dual enroll for at least part of their high school career, earning college credits while completing their high school diploma. During most years the courses offered include college math (Calculus), College English, and College History. In addition we offer the following programs:

Career and Technical

Alternative Education Opportunities/Virtual School

Vestaburg High partners with Success Virtual Learning Centers to provide our students that are struggling and not being successful in the traditional high school setting and alternative education/option. This program provides the latest in wireless technologies, free college dual enrollment, flexible scheduling, expanded home schooling options, and shared enrollment with Vestaburg High School.

Early/Middle College

Vestaburg High School offers student the opportunity to participate in an Early College Program in partnership with Montcalm Area Intermediate School District and Montcalm Community College.

Students are selected through a lottery process and are afforded the opportunity to earn both a High School Diploma and a Bachelor's Degree by attending school for a 13th year.

N.W.E.A: Assessment Program

Vestaburg Community School's implements the use of the NWEA Assessments to measure student growth. It is the goal for every VCS student to make a minimum of 1 year of academic growth and through the use of these assessments this can now be measured. Students will take assessments in math, reading, literacy, and science three (3) times a year to measure their progress. Teachers will then use this to improve both the group and the individual student instruction.
